Division I: Horticulture - *The Good Earth - Home to Our Roots*

Petite, Dwarf, Miniature or Naturally Small
Division I eligible for NGC Best-in-Show Award - Horticulture

Section A - *Summer Shade*

Class 1. Petite Evergreens

- a. Needled
- b. Scaled

Class 2. Petite Broadleaf Shrubs

- a. Evergreen
 - i. blooming
 - ii. non-blooming
- b. Deciduous
 - i. blooming
 - ii. non-blooming

Class 3. Petite Flowering Bulbs, Corms, Rhizomes, Tubers

- a. Iris
- b. Tulips
- c. Any other worthy named specimen

Class 4. Petite Blooming Perennial

- a. Dianthus
- b. Heuchera
- c. Viola
- d. Any other worthy named specimen

Class 5. Petite Container Grown - House Plants

- (4" maximum diameter container size)
- a. Blooming (e.g. African violet, miniature orchids)
 - b. Foliage (e.g. Succulents)



Division II: Design - *Visions of Fantasy Here in Our Home*

Division II eligible for NGC Best-in-Show Award - Design
Division II eligible for Novice Award

Class 1. *Welcome to Our Home* - A Petite Design at least 3" high, to be staged on a 1 1/2" high by 3 1/2" long x 2 1/2" wide, clear doll house coffee table on loan from IGC. To be exhibited on a shelf 18" above table and against the wall. Three entries.

Class 2. *Twist and Shout* - A Petite Design up to 5" on a 3 1/4" brown wooden pedestal on loan from IGC. Exhibit to be placed on a 18" tall plexiglass shelf and will be up against a wall. Design may extend beyond or below pedestal top. Four entries.

Class 3. *Tinkerbell Entertains* - An Petite Exhibition Table Design. To be staged on an individual wood base and background that is 5" high and 3 1/2" wide provided by IGC and on loan. Design not to go outside this measurement. To be exhibited on a plexiglass shelf 18" above table and against the wall. Four entries.

Class 4. *Summer Breeze* - A Petite Design using weathered wood. Staged on 8" x 8" plexiglass pedestal that is 9" high. The design is allowed to go 12" high and extend beyond the top edge of the pedestal not to exceed 12" total. Weathered wood on loan from IGC. Four entries.

Class 1. *Enjoy our Secret Place* - Fairy Gardens. Advance entry requested.

- a. Foliage fairy garden.
- b. Fairy garden with a combination of foliage and flowering plants.

Horticulture Rules - Division I

1. All horticulture entries must be fresh plant material grown by the exhibitor
2. **The exhibitor will provide and present entry in a clear, clean water container of appropriate size with no distracting markings (except for class 5).** Total stem must be visible. Container may be weighted with rocks or glass beads. Wedging, such as plastic wrap provided by the exhibitor may be used.
3. All specimens must have been in exhibitor's possession at least 90 days.
4. Good grooming and conditioning are important. No enhancement of foliage is permitted.
5. All entries should consist of one specimen unless otherwise stated.
6. **Limit of five (5) entries per person in Division I.**
7. Classes will be subdivided if each is a different variety, cultivar, type or color.
8. Exhibitor can make more than one entry per class if each is a different variety, cultivar, type or color.
9. Cut specimens should not have foliage below the water line.
10. No cut specimen shall be more than 18" from tip to cut end and contain at least 2 nodes..
12. All exhibits must be named properly by the binomial name (Genus and specific epithet) to be eligible for a Best-in-Show Award.
13. Horticulture entry cards should be filled out in advance, if possible, using pencil or waterproof pen to avoid water damage. Horticulture tags can be downloaded from the ELWD website, www.elwd.org (under Flower Shows).
14. Dwarf includes horticulture of small statue. (i.e. compact or petite etc.).
15. Container grown: A single species grown in a container. Pot size to be not more than 4". Double potting is permitted. More than one plant of the species may be exhibited in the container as a single specimen. (HB p. 58)

Design Rules - Division II

1. Advance entry required for all design classes. Call Sally Cadranell 425-883-0589. Deadline is April 27, 2018. Notify Sally if you are entering as a Novice.
2. Exhibitor must bring an approximate 3" by 5" card listing all plant material and place it by entry card. Names need not be alphabetized.
3. Novices are invited to enter all Design classes. A Novice has won 0-3 blue ribbons in a Standard Flower Show. Please specify if you are a Novice when calling to enter. Entry card will be marked "N".
4. Exhibitor must provide substitute if unable to participate.
5. Each design must be the work of one individual.
6. No artificial flowers, fruit or foliage permitted.
7. Fresh plant material is encouraged but not required..
8. Fresh plant material may never be treated, or embellished in any way.
9. Dried plant material may be treated, painted or embellished.
10. Exhibitor may use additional staging but must use properties provided and only the space allowed.

Educational Displays Rules - Division III

1. Non- competitive
2. Petite Exhibit minimum of six (6) square feet surface area.
3. Staged on half of 6" table.



Botanical Arts Rules - Division IV

1. Limit of one entry per club member. Advance entry requested. Choose Class 1a. or 1b., no limit on class size. Call Sally Cadranell phone- 425-883-0589 by April 27, 2018.
2. Plants must be in exhibitor's possession 6 weeks or more.
3. Miniature landscape/scene, **Fairy Garden** all types of accessories permitted (including mushrooms).
4. Emphasis is not necessarily on plant material, but some live plant material/s must be included. Dried plant material may also be included. No artificial plant material is permitted.
5. Each specimen must be correctly and clearly labeled with the current scientific designation and in a manner to easily identify the specimen's location in the gardens. This may be done with a single chart or individual placards. (HB p. 92)

Glossary of Terms:

Fairy Garden: A container-grown miniature landscape/scene, all types of accessories permitted. Emphasis is not on plant material, but entry must include plants with scientific designations. (HB p. 92) Featured: To be dominant. (HB p. 145)

Petite Design: A Design ranging in size from 3" to 12" including container. May be traditional or creative. (HB p. 73)

Treated Plant Material: The term 'treated' refers to the artificial altering of the exterior appearance of *dried plant material* by use of a substance, e.g., dye, paint, stains, bleach, shellac, glitter, etc. (HB p. 153)

Dwarf includes: Dwarf, Miniature or Naturally Small growth habit.

Container Grown: A single species grown in a container.



Awards:

The NGC Standard System of Awarding is used in all divisions. (HB p.25)

Two NGC Best-of-Show Awards will be offered, one in Horticulture and one in Design.

A Novice Award will be offered in Division II, Design and will be given to the highest scoring Novice Design. The Design does not need to be a top ribbon winner.

A Club Fairy Garden Award will be offered in Division IV, Botanical Arts, for the Fairy Garden classes. The Award will be given to the highest scoring of the combined Fairy Garden classes. The Design does not need to be a top ribbon winner.
